

# CLINICAL OPERATIONS UPDATE: COVID-19 AUGUST 25, 2023 FIFTEEN WEEKS FOLLOWING END OF PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY

# MONITORING DATA

Dr. Meghan Gump and I are continuing to monitor public health data for COVID-19. Data currently available includes hospitalizations in Massachusetts and wastewater monitoring. We will use data to inform any decisions we need to make regarding a change in practice at VMG (Data is available at: <a href="https://www.mass.gov/info-details/covid-19-response-reporting">https://www.mass.gov/info-details/covid-19-response-reporting</a>).

# PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT (PPE)

- Surgical masks remain available for patients at the entry to the health center along with hand hygiene dispensers. Patients are to be directed to wear a mask for any visit of COVID-19 concern, suspicion or confirmed disease.
- Surgical masks are available at entry points for staff and providers as needed.
- If a patient requests you were a mask while delivering clinical care, please respect their preferences by doing so.
- N95 masks are available in our centers, clinical areas for care of patients with suspicion or confirmed COVID-19.
- Gloves, gowns and eye protection remain available as needed.
- The next round of fit testing will take place this fall at our health centers for those that wear N95 masks. Information will follow from your center.
- At this time there are no plans to <u>require</u> masks to be worn at all times in the health centers, unless directed to do so by MA DPH, another regulatory requirement or a dramatic change in the presence of disease.

### QUARANTINE GUIDELINES FOR COVID-19

- There have been no changes to the quarantine guidelines for COVID-19.
- Exposure and illness are to be reported to your manager/coordinator/team leader and the guidelines followed for your circumstances.

### **COVID-19 VACCINES FALL 2023**

- It is anticipated there will be a new COVID-19 vaccine this fall, and as early as September available at local pharmacies. Important to note if someone receives a COVID-19 booster now, it may delay a person's eligibility to receive a new vaccine in this fall. More will be known when recommendations are published.
- VMG will not supply the new COVID-19 vaccine for adults when it is made available this fall, patients should be referred to a local pharmacy.
